The meeting site (VSU Extension Pavilion) can be reached from I-95, Exit 54 by turning left at the stoplight off the exit ramp and left at the second stoplight onto Route 301 (Boulevard); at 4th stoplight turn right onto Dupuy Road and keep straight to River Road past Virginia State University for 1-1/4 miles to stoplight. Bear right at the yield sign. Go over bridge and drive straight ahead for 1/4 mile. Entrance to Pavilion on left (second gate).
